

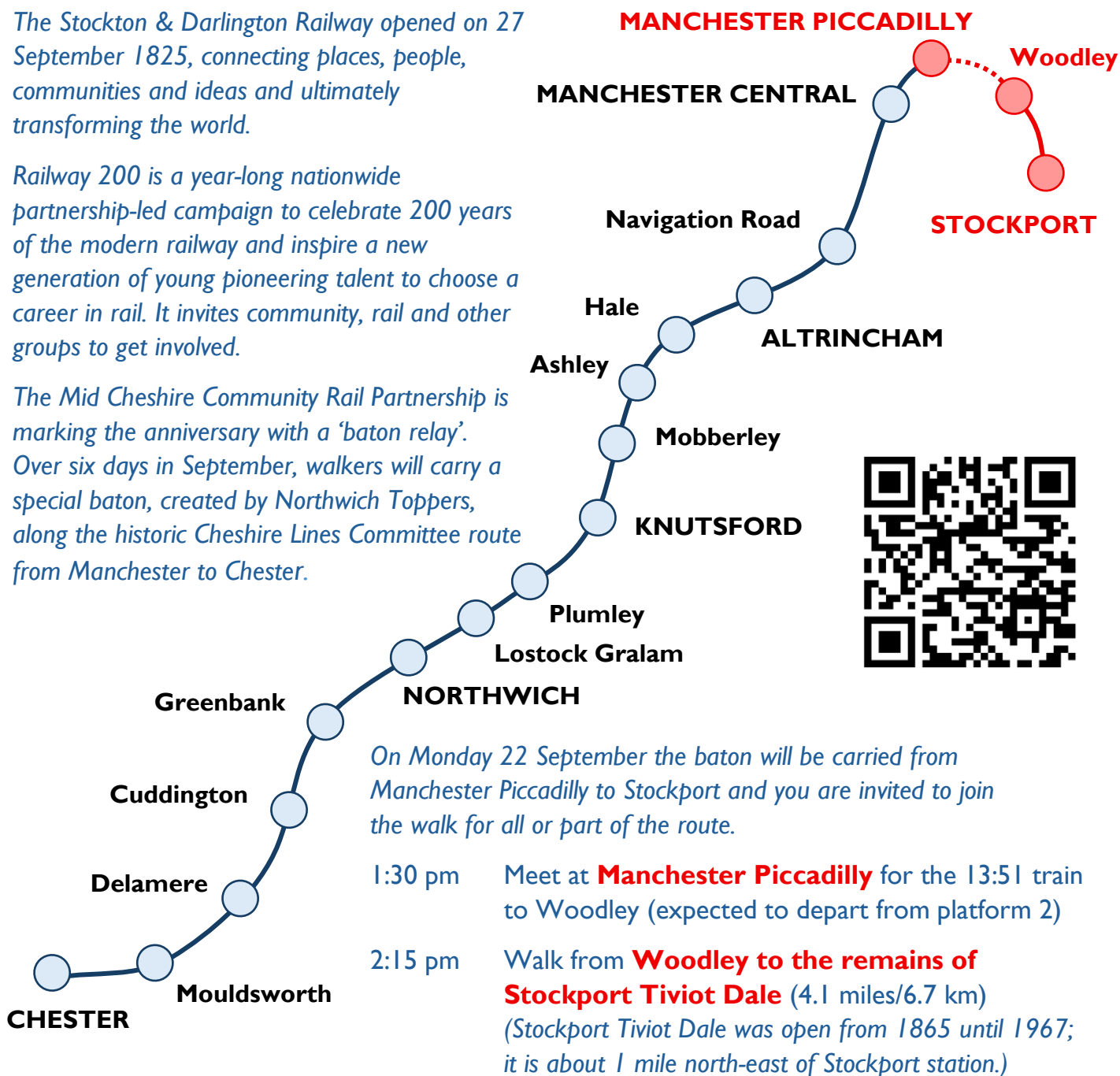
Mid Cheshire Line – Railway 200

Station to Station relay walk

The Stockton & Darlington Railway opened on 27 September 1825, connecting places, people, communities and ideas and ultimately transforming the world.

Railway 200 is a year-long nationwide partnership-led campaign to celebrate 200 years of the modern railway and inspire a new generation of young pioneering talent to choose a career in rail. It invites community, rail and other groups to get involved.

The Mid Cheshire Community Rail Partnership is marking the anniversary with a 'baton relay'. Over six days in September, walkers will carry a special baton, created by Northwich Toppers, along the historic Cheshire Lines Committee route from Manchester to Chester.



On Monday 22 September the baton will be carried from Manchester Piccadilly to Stockport and you are invited to join the walk for all or part of the route.

- 1:30 pm Meet at **Manchester Piccadilly** for the 13:51 train to Woodley (expected to depart from platform 2)
- 2:15 pm Walk from **Woodley to the remains of Stockport Tiviot Dale** (4.1 miles/6.7 km) (Stockport Tiviot Dale was open from 1865 until 1967; it is about 1 mile north-east of Stockport station.)
